

SciencesPo Dual degree program



Are you ready for the opportunity of a lifetime?

Travel abroad, immerse yourself in the French culture, learn a new language and complete a dual degree – all at the same time.

The dual degree

The first of its kind in Australia, two of the world's leading institutions for the humanities and social sciences – the University of Sydney's Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences and Sciences Po in France – have come together to offer students a new dual degree program.

Sciences Po

Sciences Po is a distinguished research-intensive and internationally focused university specialising in the social sciences and humanities. It is highly regarded for its education of new leaders in many fields, including politics. An innovator in international Bachelor of Arts dual degree programs, Sciences Po has established other dual degree programs with Columbia University, Hong Kong

University, Keio University, National University of Singapore, University College London, and the University of British Columbia.

The University of Sydney's Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences

Internationally recognised, the University of Sydney has been ranked 14th in the world for Arts and Humanities by the QS World University Rankings.

At the University, you will join a diverse academic community of leading scholars and more than 55,000 students from around Australia and the world. The faculty's teaching and research staff are internationally acclaimed specialists in their fields.

About the program

- **Year 1:** Sciences Po, commence program in France in August
- **Year 2:** Sciences Po
- **Year 3:** The University of Sydney, continue program in Sydney from July
- **Year 4:** The University of Sydney.

The four-year dual degree program is available to both international and domestic students.

If accepted into the program, you will work towards both:

- a Bachelor of Arts degree at Sciences Po, and
- either a Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Economics or a Bachelor of Political, Economic and Social Sciences degree at the University of Sydney.

The locations

You will complete the first two years of the program in France, at one of three regional campuses. Each campus focuses on a particular region of the world:

- **Le Havre** – located on the Normandy coast, focuses on the relationship between Europe and Asia.
- **Menton** – located on the French Riviera, focuses on the relationships between the northern and southern sides of the Mediterranean, as well as the analysis of the links between Europe and the Middle East.
- **Reims** – located in the Champagne region, 45 minutes outside of Paris, focuses on the comparative understanding of Europe and North America.

Courses are taught in English, although you may select alternate languages of instruction as your comfort level in the respective language of instruction increases.

After completing the first two years of study in France, you will then move to the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at the University of Sydney to continue your third and fourth year of studies in either the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Economics or the Bachelor of Political, Economic and Social Sciences.



Make international friends for life

The regional campuses are small and intimate, with a student population of no more than 300 students at Le Havre and Menton campuses and no more than 600 students at the Reims campus. This ensures small class sizes and an interactive community.

Applications

Prospective students need to apply directly to the University of Sydney for admission into the dual degree. In addition, domestic school-leavers applying for admission in 2017 need to ensure that a UAC application is completed for other course preferences, if applicable.

Shortlisted applicants will be advised
- **March 2017**
Second round interviews (Paris)
- **April 2017**
Second round offers released

Admission requirements

Admission to the dual degree program is highly competitive. Acceptance to the program will be determined by a Sciences Po and University of Sydney Dual Degree Admissions Committee

based on evidence of academic achievement and intellectual readiness, and on an applicant's own representation of their experience, ideas and aspirations. Applicants need to also meet the minimum admission requirements for their degree of choice at the University of Sydney, including the English language requirements.

During years 1-2 students will enrol at Sciences Po, France and pay the applicable fee direct. During years 3-4 students will enrol in the applicable CRICOS-registered Sydney degree with transfer credits from studies undertaken at Sciences Po.
